The "Irish" government and its educators conceal Britain's genocide of Ireland by falsely insisting that Ireland's landlords during the Holocaust were Irish. Here is how "Irish" they were. Of the above four named members of Queen Victoria's First Council, three were landlords with the following acreage:

Lord Lansdowne, 142,916 acres of which 121,349 in Ireland;

Lord Palmerston, 19,365 acres of which 12,426 in Ireland.

Lord John Russell, 4,230 acres of which 4,184 in Ireland. All three were so "Irish" as to have been Prime Ministers of Britain! (Lansdowne once, Palmerston twice, and Russell twice, one of which in 1846-1852.) Another "Irish" landlord was the Duke of Devonshire, 198,665 acres of which 60,036 in Ireland. That Dukedom, too, had been Prime Minister.

The Irish were tenants. Until 1900-1920 English landlords owned Ireland, possessing robbery-based land-titles. See Bateman's *The Great Landowners of Great Britain and Ireland* (1878)
